Logistics

- For class April 5, for each person in your group bring two copies of written comments (one for your group members and one for me)
- We'll take half the class so you all can discuss your comments within the group
- You should have received an invitation to a google folder. Inside this folder are subfolders for each group. Put your draft in this appropriate sub-folder by midnight April 2.
