To make sure that your project is on track, submit a one page proposal in which you outline what you are planning to do for this policy brief.

Recall that the mandate for this assignment is to

- write a 5 to 10 page brief, pictures included
- with 5 to 8 graphics
- make visualizations in R
- use data that require some form of aggregation
  - o this could be individual-level data and you write about averages
  - this could be neighborhood-level data and you write about cities
  - o this could be city-level data and you write about cities on average

In your one-page proposal write

- Write me what you are planning to write about
- the data you're planning to use
- what kind of aggregation you're planning on
- a general outline of the things you'd like to say and how you'll show them with data

Be sure to identify the data and convince me that they include the information you'd like to analyze.
